Where There's Fire

Venerable British fireplace manufacturer **Chesney's** (whose United States showrooms are in New York and Atlanta) has launched a line of chimneypieces that faithfully reproduce 18th- and 19th-century examples by Sir John Soane. As with all of Soane's designs, the Soane Pattern V shows the English architect's facility for blending traditional motifs in surprising new ways.
